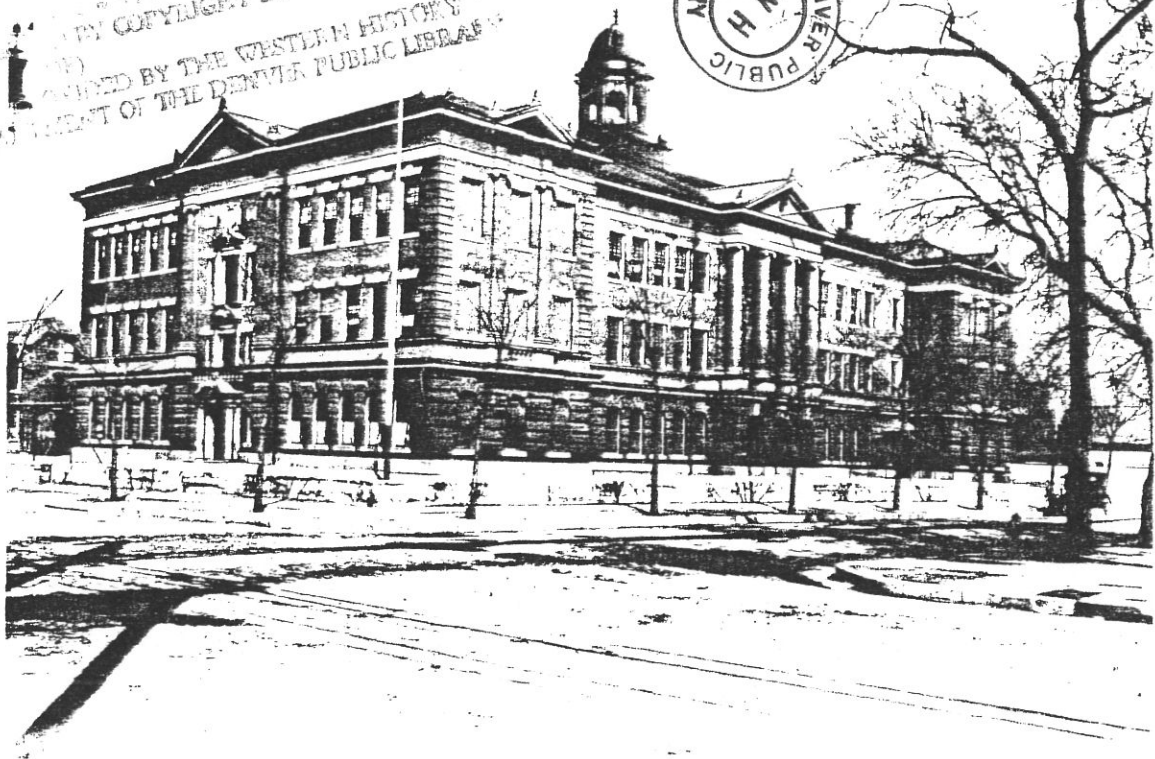

NEW EVANS SCHOOL, FINEST IN THE WEST, READY FOR OCCUPANCY MARCH 1

One of Denver's Magnificent new school buildings.

The Evans school, at West Eleventh and South Fifteenth Avenues, is almost completed as far as the exterior is concerned and by March 1 it is hoped to have the entire building in shaped for the pupils.

At the very latest calculation the pupils will enter for school next September.

David W. Dryden drew the plans. The building cost \$130,000 and is said to be the most modern and best equipped school building in the West and one of the finest in the United States.

It has fifteen regular school rooms and other rooms for kindergarten, tool and shop work and cooking and will accomodate about 750 pupils.

Chief among its features are a magnificent heating plant designed by the Golf Heating company, and said to be the most effective plant in the United States; also a large space on the roof of the building for the physical culture classes and an auditorium holding over 800 people.
